No Man Is Justified By the Law

When you first read the words of Paul in Galatians 3:11 you may not immediately understand the impact of what He said. "But that no one is justified by the law is evident..." This truth forces you to deal with how men were saved during the times of the Old Testament if no one is justified by the

law. How could anyone be saved from Adam to the coming of Jesus?

When God revealed His covenant at Mount Sinai, He told them to offer sacrifices. Why? As He described the various animal sacrifices He repeatedly said, "And it shall be forgiven" (Lev. 4:20, 26, 31, 35; 5:10, 13, 16, 18; 6:7; 19:22; Num. 14:19; 15:25, 26, 28; Deut. 21:8). More than a dozen times God told them their sins would be forgiven when they offered

the sacrifices. How then can Paul describe some who did these very things and much more yet were not forgiven? Paul does say that no one is justified by the law!

What about Abel, Enoch, Noah, Abraham, Jacob and so many others, especially David? They lived under the Old Testament, and no one doubts their salvation, yet Paul said that no one is justified by the law. How can this be?

What about those in Hebrews 11. So many righteous people are listed there, and then the writer adds these words,

"Time would not permit me to tell of Gideon and Barak and Samson, also of David and Samuel and the prophets" (Heb. 11:32). Yet, Paul said that no one is justified by the law.

The writer then lists verbs, nouns and adjectives to describe the righteousness of these unnamed saints. "Through faith subdued kingdoms, worked righteousness; obtained promises...quenched fires...valiant...tortured...trials of mockings and scourgings...chains...imprisonment...stoned...sawn...

slain...wandered in deserts and mountains...dens... and caves..." He then shows the assurance of their salvation by saying, "All these having obtained a good testimony through faith." They were accepted and saved while living under Old Testament law. Yet, Paul said that no one is justified by the law!

The key to understanding how this could be is to look at New Testament scribes and Pharisees.

They sought salvation by their own acts of righteousness based on the law. They boasted of the fact that they fasted twice every week, gave alms (with sounding trumpets) prayed long prayers (on street corners) etc. What was missing? Paul says, "Because they did not seek it by faith, but as it were, by the works of the law" (Rom. 9:32). Faith without obedience is dead faith; but obedience without faith is just as dead! Knowing the Bible but seeking salvation without faith leads to disaster. Is it possible that some today are making this same mistake?

The Truth About Jesus (Part 3 of 7): The Great Vindication

The transforming truth of Jesus Christ is certain, supreme, clear and relevant to our lives (1 Tim. 3:16a). Paul outlines six pivotal elements of this truth, which are critical to understanding and appreciating the magnitude of Jesus Christ and His plan for us. We studied first the great incarnation.

Second, Paul emphasizes THE GREAT VINDICATION: the
"He was vindicated by the Spirit."

The Spirit

What does that mean? Some of the older translations had "justified in the Spirit" (KJV, NKJV) or "justified in the spirit" (ASV). "Justified" is a good translation of the Greek word, as that is how it is most often translated, but it is not implying that Jesus had sins from which He needed to be "justified." The term also means "to vindicate, to prove to be

right, avouch to be good and true." When and how did that happen in the life of Christ? While this could be talking about Christ's human "spirit" (with a lower case "s," as in the ASV), it seems to be more likely pointing to Christ being vindicated or proved to be right by the Holy Spirit. Let's consider three specific times when the Holy Spirit is seen avouching for Christ.

Jesus was vindicated by the Spirit at His baptism. Jesus was baptized in order "to fulfill all righteousness" (Matt. 3:15) and, more especially, to prove His divine identity. John

was told, "Upon whom you see the Spirit descending, and remaining on Him, this is He who baptizes with the Holy Spirit" (John 1:33). When "the heavens were opened" and "the Spirit of God" descended "like a dove" upon Jesus, John said, "I have seen and testified that this is the Son of God" (John 1:34).

Jesus was vindicated by the Spirit in His power over evil spirits. In the face of denial and rejection, especially by the Pharisees, who accused Jesus of working for the devil, "the

ruler of the demons" (Matt. 12:24), Jesus was able to state and to prove (for there was no other plausible explanation) that He "cast out demons by the Spirit of God" (Matt. 12:28). Jesus had power over evil because He worked in concert with the Spirit of God Himself, not the devil!

Christ! Jesus was vindicated by the Spirit in His resurrection. "Lawless hands" took Jesus and at "murdered" Him "by hanging on a tree" (Acts 2:23; 5:30; ut 10:39). But God was not done proving who Jesus is! Jesus it Christ was "declared to be the Son of God with power according to the Spirit of holiness, by the resurrection from the dead" e- (Rom. 1:4). The Spirit worked to prove the deity of Christ!

This indisputable truth ought to transform our lives toward godliness! As the Lord's church, we are "the pillar and ground of the truth" (1 Tim. 3:15). We must know it! We must teach it! We must defend it! (more next week)

It's a Heatwave

Have you noticed how hot it has been lately? It's not too surprising when you live in Florida and it's the middle of August, but this summer seems particularly hot.

Too much sun can be very dangerous. If you aren't careful to apply sunscreen you can end up with a bad sunburn in

minutes. If you don't drink enough water or stay in the sun too long you can become dehydrated or suffer heat stroke. You have to take the heat seriously. You need relief.

God doesn't

When the heat is bearing down on you, nothing feels better than a cloud coming over and providing some shade. Suddenly, you can open your eyes wide and take in the breeze as long as the cover remains.

Our lives can sometimes feel like we're under a heatwave. While we expect things to go wrong every now and then, sometimes a bunch of things can go wrong at once. Between trying to pay bills, taking care of our families, and maintaining our relationships, there is a lot of room for things to go haywire. When problems pile up, we can easily become overwhelmed with stress and worry. We may find ourselves wishing that our problems would just go away but lacking the hope that they ever will.

Thankfully, there is a solution to our troubles. In Isaiah 25, the prophet tells us about the wonderful God we have. He is a God who is faithful and true (v. 1). He is a God who protects His people (v. 2). But He is also a God who gives His people relief. In verse 4, Isaiah says, "For You have been a strength to the poor, a strength to the needy in his distress, a refuge from the storm, a shade from the heat..." God doesn't want you to suffer. He wants to give you relief.

The Bible is filled with passage after passage that describe God's desire and ability to take our burdens away. In Psalm 23:3, David writes that God "...restores my soul." 1 Peter 5:7 tells us that God "...cares for you." Philippians 4:19 says, "...my God will supply every need of yours..." God desires to care for us, and we can rest assured that He is.

God cares so much for our well-being that He centered His divine will around our greatest need. Back in Isaiah 25, God's ability to shade us from evil is most perfectly fulfilled in the coming of Jesus. "He will swallow up death forever, and the Lord God will wipe away tears from all faces...We have waited for Him; We will be glad and rejoice in His salvation" (v. 8-9).

There will be times when it seems nothing is going right. But there is a cloud of relief coming. If we faithfully wait on the Lord, He will rescue us from all of life's worries.

"We're doing this for God—He'll accept it!"

It is interesting how man has made worship more about "man" and "man's likes" than he has about God and God's demands. There is a mentality, which is often voiced, regarding worship that, "We're doing this for God, to give the praise to Him. He will accept it." Unfortunately, such sentiments are actually proven completely contrary to what God will accept.

Many examples of worship in the Bible could be cited to show that God, in fact, does not accept just any effort of man to worship Him, including Cain (Gen. 4:3-5), Nadab and Abihu (Lev. 10:1-3), King Saul (1 Sam. 13:1-14), many Jews (Matt. 15:8-9), etc. But consider closely the sincerity of the persons who will say to Jesus at the judgm

of the persons who will say to Jesus at the judgment, "Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in Your name, cast out demons in Your name, and done many wonders in Your name?" (Matt. 7:22). It is not enough to think that the Lord will accept what I do for Him (including in worship)! We must truly do "the will of [the] Father in heaven" (7:21)! Does your worship follow the demands of God in the New Testament? – DS

"Fight against those who fight against me"

King David faced much opposition in his life. Many times he had to flee and run for his life. His enemies were not always foreign nations, but sometimes his own king (Saul) and sometimes his own son (Absalom). David's heart is transparent as you read through the book of Psalms, as he lays it open in his appeals to God. Consider this one from the first verse of Psalm

35: "Fight against those who fight against me."

suffer.

David makes that appeal because he knows that God had already been doing that, so he has absolute confidence, in the midst of his despair, that God will certainly continue to fight for him.

What about you? Do you know that God will fight for you (Deut. 1:30; 20:4)? Do you know that God is more powerful than any enemy you face, including and especially the devil (1 John 4:4)? Do you know that the strength for your battles comes only from the Lord (Eph. 6:10-18)? Do you know that it doesn't matter who is "against us" when "God is for us" (Rom. 8:31)? -DS
