The Importance of the Jewish Annual Feast Days

Whatever was

written before

was written to

give us hope in

our own lives

It was in the spring of the year when the barley the Jews had planted began to ripen, and they entered the fields. The Jews came together at this time for one of the three annual feast days, and part of the harvest was waved before God. Every Jewish male was required by God to come and

spend time together rejoicing in what God had done for them.

That time was special, for it commemorated the precise time of the year when the Jews had left Egyptian bondage. It is hard to imagine how any Jew could forget that final plague, the death of the firstborn, and what they were doing as the plague came. They gathered together and ate the Passover lamb and were dressed and ready to depart. The bread they ate that night was different for it had

been made without leaven—there was no time to wait for it to rise. It was God's will for them to duplicate this event as they kept the Passover. God had passed over (bypassed) every house where the blood of that lamb had been on the outside of their houses. We too are blessed by the blood of the Lamb.

It is interesting to note that God promised them that no enemy would attack their unguarded homes while they were absent. There is no record of this ever happening until 66 A.D., as God sent Rome to begin plans to destroy Jerusalem.

Seven weeks after the feast of Passover was celebrated, the feast of weeks or the feast of first-fruits was kept. By this time the wheat was ready to be gathered, and sheaves of wheat were waved before the altar. It was a time of joy and all Jewish males assembled to rejoice before God.

All Jewish males assembled together, and it was truly a time of joy, for God said, "You shall rejoice before the Lord your God, you and your son and your daughter, your male

servant and your female servant, the Levite who is within your gates, the stranger and the fatherless and the widow who are among you, at the place where the Lord your God chooses to make His name abide" (Deut. 16:11).

We know this feast better because it came on the morning seven weeks after the Passover sabbath. As this was fifty days, the Greek word for fifty

(Pentecost) is the word used in the New Testament for this feast. Now consider this. Pentecost is also a time of joy for us because the church began, and this joy is for all men, women, sons, daughters, foreigners, orphans and widows. This day marks the time when all mankind finds joy in what began to happen. That "day of harvest" spread throughout the world, and Jews and Gentiles were part of it. Pentecost is when the door opened to all of us! Enough for this week—we'll look at the feast of tabernacles, the third feast, next week.

The Truth About Jesus (Part 4 of 7): The Great Exaltation

The transforming truth of Jesus Christ is certain, supreme, clear and relevant to our lives (1 Tim. 3:16a). In this verse, the Holy Spirit emphasizes six pivotal elements of this truth to help us appreciate the magnitude of Jesus Christ and His plan for us, including the great incarnation and the great

vindication.

Third, Paul emphasizes THE GREAT EXALTA-TION: "He was seen by angels."

What does that mean? The word "angels" comes from the Greek word angelos—you can see the English word "angel" in the Greek word. The word means both "angel" (i.e., a transcendent power sent to carry out various tasks for God) and "messenger" (i.e., a human messenger serving as an

envoy). While some have been inclined to understand the word in this verse as human messengers, it seems better contextually to take it just as the translations have it—angels sent forth by God. When one reads the life of Christ, there are many occasions when angels are present. They are not merely there to observe, but they are captivated by and closely involved in the life and work of Jesus, having been sent forth to minister to and on behalf of the Son of God. Consider these occasions when angels of heaven served our Savior.

Angels foretold the birth of Jesus Christ. The angel Gabriel told Mary that she would bring forth the Son of God (Luke 1:26-38), and then an angel told Joseph that the baby was of the Holy Spirit (Matt. 1:18-25).

Angels announced the birth of Jesus to shepherds who were in the fields (Luke 2:8-15).

Angels ministered to Jesus after He triumphed over the temptations of the devil (Matt. 4:11).

Angels strengthened Jesus while He was agonizing in the Garden of Gethsemane (Luke 22:43).

Angels announced the resurrection of Jesus from the dead (Matt. 28:1-7; Luke 24:4-7).

Angels promised that Jesus would come again, as He was ascending (Acts 1:9-11).

Even now and in the future, angels serve in various capacities to fulfill the will of God. While He is on the throne, angels "are subject to" Jesus (1 Pet. 3:22). "Many angels" are "around the throne" worshiping Jesus right now (Rev. 5:11-14). When Jesus comes again, "all the holy angels" will come with Him (Matt. 25:31).

This indisputable truth ought to transform our lives toward godliness! As the Lord's church, we are "the pillar and ground of the truth" (1 Tim. 3:15). We must know it! We must teach it! We must defend it! (more next week)



Admit It and He Will Forgive You!

You've probably seen this scene in a movie. After many hours of questioning, an interrogation officer moves a light directly into his suspect's eyes. He slams the table and shouts, "Admit it!" The suspect breaks down and pours his heart out. The police get their man, and it's a job well done.

Admitting guilt is not easy. We will go to great lengths to keep our worst sins to ourselves. Because, if we admit our faults, we might hurt our reputation. Or worse, we might have to give them up.

No good comes from keeping sins secret. faults... we might You rob yourself of an opportunity to repent, and you also open yourself up to more sin. This was King David's great failure. "David did what was right in the eyes of the Lord, and had not turned aside from anything that He commanded him all the days of his life, except in the matter of Uriah the Hittite" (1 Kgs. 15:5).

In 2 Samuel 11, David gave in to temptation and took another man's wife for himself. When Bathsheba became pregnant, David didn't do the right thing and admit his guilt. Instead, he looked for ways to cover it up. When his plans failed, he sent Uriah, Bathsheba's husband, to die in battle. David then went about his life like nothing had happened. As far as he was concerned, he got away with it, and no one was the wiser. But the Lord knew.

Because of these sins, David's family was plagued with turmoil including the death of his child. It was only when he was confronted by Nathan, the prophet, that he finally admitted his sin (2 Sam. 12:13). When he did, God forgave him immediately. If David admitted his sin from the start, he would have been saved from far greater sorrow.

> It is hard to admit when we do wrong, especially when we think can keep our secret from getting out. Like David, we go about our lives like nothing is wrong, feeling good about ourselves.

> God knows the secrets of the heart (Psa. 44:21). Sins have consequences, whether they are found out or not. By refusing to repent of them, we dig a deeper and deeper hole to get out of. But, if we would just admit it, we can make the changes we

need to be in a right relationship with God, and He will forgive us (1 John 1:9).

The day will come for each of us when we will be under the light of the Judge of Heaven, and there will no longer be an opportunity to admit our guilt. If you are a Christian and have secret sin, just admit it, and God will forgive you as quickly as He forgave King David. "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9).

The queen of Sheba heard of King Solomon's great wealth and wisdom from the Lord, but she did not believe it. She came "to test him with hard questions" (1 Kgs. 10:1). After she had "seen all the wisdom of Solomon" and his great prosperity, the queen confessed, "It was a true report which I heard... However I did not believe the words until I came and saw with

my own eyes; and indeed the half was not told me. Your wisdom and prosperity exceed the fame of which I heard" (10:4-7). She also realized the source of his greatness—"Blessed be the Lord your God who delighted in you" (10:9).

Brothers and sisters, we have wealth and wisdom that far surpasses what Solomon had! We are rich in God's grace and forgiveness (Eph. 2:4-7). We have the treasure of the eternally-planned (Eph. 3:9-11), blood-bought (Acts 20:28) church of Christ (Matt. 13:44). We live under the new covenant (Heb. 9:15-17) and have the complete revelation of God (2 Tim. 3:17; 2 Pet. 1:3; Jude 3). When it comes to the rich blessings we have Christ, the half has not been told! - DS

Hide the stains

Restaurants and hotels purposefully use carpet that has so many designs and patterns that stains are not easily noticed. They just blend right in. Do we ever try to hide stains in our own lives in similar fashion?

The Lord says that our "sins are like scarlet...are red like crim-

son" (Isa. 1:18). That is not an easy stain to hide. Have you ever spilled grape juice on your white shirt? That's not coming out and everyone is going to see it. The old hymn says, "Sin had left a crimson stain." That's not easy to get out (or is it?).

You may be able to get your sin-stained soul to blend in with other sin-stained souls around you, but it will never be hidden from the eyes of God! However, it is God who can make you "as white as snow" (Isa. 1:18). When the blood of Jesus washes "us from our sins" (Rev. 1:5), the stain is gone! Even God cannot (and will not) see it any longer (Heb. 8:12)! So, stop trying to hide your sins! Confess them (1 John 1:9), stop them (1 John 2:1) and be cleansed from them (2 Cor. 7:1). - DS
