Galatians

The churches in Galatia were being plagued by false teachers and were turning away from Christ and His gospel. Paul sought to remind them of the true liberty that Christians have in Christ (and in no other), but they must stand fast in His truth. Then They Understood

When Jesus came into the lives of those fishermen from Galilee, His message sounded so different from anything they had ever heard. He did not teach as those leaders in the synagogue. The Sermon on the Mount ends with these words. "The people were astonished at His teaching, for He taught

them as one having authority, and not as the scribes" (Matt. 7:28-29). His method of teaching was not the only difference between Him and other teachers. His message revealed a New Testament way of living.

When He described how John the Baptist fulfilled the prophecy that Elijah would come, the apostles could not understand how that could be. When He explained that difficult prophecy to them the Bible described what happened. "Then His disciples understood..." (Matt. 17:13).

In Matthew chapter sixteen, there is a description of His confrontation with the Pharisees and Sadducees and their request for a sign. He left them and went with His disciples to another place. He said to them, "Take heed and beware of the leaven of the Pharisees and Sadducees." They failed to see how He was not speaking of actual leaven, and they arrived at the conclusion that He was rebuking them because they had failed to bring bread so they could share it. Jesus rebuked

them and described them as those who had such little faith. He reminded them of feeding the 5,000 and also of the 4,000. Had they remembered these two events, they should have understood that He was not concerned about getting bread. It was at this point that the situation changed. "Then they understood that He did not tell them to beware of the leaven of bread, but of the doctrine of Pharisees and Sadducees" (v. 12).

The "sinners prayer" was never preached until 1700 years after Pentecost

foundation!

There is a parallel to this event in our own world when those who are religious leaders fail to reveal the New Testament way of living. An illustration of this is the prevalence of the use of the sinner's prayers to describe the path to Jesus. This prayer often consists of about twenty words—when one says it, he is told that he is immediately saved. This prayer is not found even one time in the entire Bible.

The first recorded use of it was in 1741, but it was not until the next century that it became widespread. Neither Jesus nor His apostles ever told any man to use this prayer. There is a path to heaven He has revealed to us. I challenge you to study the book of Acts, where many asked the question about what they must do to be saved and heaven's answer to the question was given. It is far different from saying about twenty words! Consider these words, "Beware of the leaven (the teachings) of pastors and televangelists" who teach a path to salvation no one ever heard of for hundreds of years.

When Doubts Arise

The devil is the Master of Doubts! He has mastered the ability to plant seeds of doubt regarding just about everything! For example: who would have ever thought that someone would doubt what a man is and doubt what a woman is. That's the devil at work! He has all sizes of doubts in his bag—

he likes to start with small ones and then work his way up.

Has this Master of Deception ever used one of his "devices" (2 Cor. 2:11) to cause "doubts" to "arise in your heart" (Luke 24:38)? Doubts about God, about Jesus, about the Bible, about the church, about doctrine, about morality, about eternity, etc.? What can you do when doubts start to creep in and settle themselves down in your heart? It is usually helpful to just go back and make sure your foundation in the basics is rock solid.

- 1. The God of the Bible exists. Of this, there can be NO doubt! "His invisible attributes are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made" (Rom. 1:20). "The creation of the world" is on full display 24/7 for anyone and everyone to see, examine, test and draw honest, evidence-based conclusions. Examine the evidence! Reason soundly!
- **2.** The Bible is fully inspired of God. Of this, there can be NO doubt! One of the eyewitnesses affirmed that "we have

the prophetic word confirmed" (2 Pet. 1:19). He knew that what was written and what he was writing was of no "private interpretation...but holy men of God spoke as they were moved by the Holy Spirit" (1:20-21). Again, the evidence is on full display. Read the Bible. Examine the evidence of Divine origin within its pages! Reason soundly!

3. Whatever the Bible says is from God. When I up. know (with no reason to doubt) that the God of the Bible exists and that He gave every word of the Bible, then I can have absolute confidence that what this Book teaches is "perfect...sure...right...pure...true and righteous altogether" (Psa. 19:7-9). I can trust every word!

God teaches in the Bible that there is only one church (Eph. 4:4). No reason to doubt that!

God teaches in the Bible to sing acapella in His worship (Eph. 5:19). No reason to doubt that!

God teaches in the Bible that He wants males to lead the church (1 Tim. 2:8-14; 3:1-13). No reason to doubt that!

God teaches in the Bible that there are only two genders (Gen. 2:18-25; Matt. 19:4-5). No reason to doubt that!

God teaches in the Bible that to change His Word leads to anathema (Gal. 1:9). No reason to doubt that either!

When doubts arise, check your foundation! Don't let the devil exploit any weak spots! If God says it, that settles it!

Is God Listening?

King Saul was a serious disappointment. When we are introduced to him in 1 Samuel 9, he was impressive in his own right. Although Saul didn't come from a great tribe of Israel, he had a powerful father, and he became the tallest and most handsome man in Israel.

But Saul wasn't just impressive to look at. Saul also had a great sense of duty and humility. When his father lost his prized donkeys, Saul diligently looked for them. Eventually, he inquired of Samuel to seek his advice as a man of God. There, he learned of God's plans for him to become king. His response was to ask 'why him?' (1 Sam. 9:21). And when it came time for him to be anointed, he didn't rush to take power but was found hiding (1 Sam. 10:22).

However, it wasn't long before the humble, obedient Saul became the Saul we are more familiar with. Eventually, he let his fears and pride consume his every action. He profaned the sacrifice, disobeyed God's command to destroy the Amalekites, and sought to murder David over and over again. Saul lost God's favor. In 1 Samuel 15:11, God declared, "I greatly regret that I have set up Saul as king, for he has turned his back on Me..."

Saul had made himself as far from God as he could

possibly be. So, when the Philistines rose up against him and he knew he was in trouble, he went back to Samuel, the man of God who helped all those years ago. However, Samuel was dead, and so Saul sought a witch to conjure his spirit. But Samuel's response wasn't what Saul wanted to hear. Samuel said, "So why do you ask me, seeing the Lord has departed from you and has become your enemy?" (1 Sam. 28:16). Saul wanted good news from God, but God was no longer listening.

Many of us are familiar with the verse from James 5:16, "The effective fervent prayer of a righteous man avails much." It is one of the greatest blessings of being a Christian. However, what does this imply about an unrighteous man? Proverbs 15:29 tells us that instead of hearing his prayers, "The Lord is far from the wicked..." If we stop living for God, He will stop hearing our prayers.

Many Christians have a life that looks like Saul's. We follow God's words, and He answers all of our prayers. At some point, we allow sin to reenter our lives. We make a few moral compromises here and there, but God still seems to be listening. So, we make more compromises. Eventually, we find ourselves living a life no different from the world except for one thing: before we lay our head on our pillow, we say our prayer and ask for God's help. If we stop listening to God, we should not be surprised when He responds, "Why do you ask Me?"

What every man needs to hear

But being a true Christian involves "giving all diligence" (2 Pet. 1:5), "always abounding in the work of the Lord" (1 Cor. 15:58) and doing "good to all," especially our fellow Christians (Gal. 6:10). 
