Are You Concerned About the Future?

It was Jesus who described the final judgment and discussed the right hand and left hand of the Judge of all mankind. It is truly the most sobering thought that you and I will be there and hear the judgment given as to where we shall be forever and ever.

Every person who has ever lived will

be there, for the graves will have been opened. The Judge said,

"The hour is coming in which all who are in the graves will hear His voice and come forth" (John 5:28 -29). Paul described it, "We must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, that each one may receive the things done in the body" (2 Cor. 5:10).

The universe, the heavens and the earth will have ceased. Their time of existence will terminate on that day of judgment (2 Pet. 3:7). This is the day

"...in which the heavens will pass away with a great noise, and the elements will melt with fervent heat; both the earth and the works that are in it will be burned up" (2 Pet. 3:10).

The judgment will take place, and like a shepherd in ancient days separated the sheep from the goats in his flock, so the Shepherd will separate the righteous from the ungodly. You and I will be placed with the righteous "sheep" on His right hand or the unrighteous "goats" on His left hand. The final judgment will happen in this way.

"Then the King will say to those on His right hand, 'Come, you blessed of My Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world" (Matt. 25:34). His final message to those on His left hand will be, "Depart from Me, you cursed, into the everlasting fire prepared for the devil and his angels" (Matt. 25:41). You and I will hear one or the other of two sentences—"Come, you blessed of My Father," or "Depart from Me, you cursed."

The reality of this time should impact every decision we make and the basis on which we make them. Nothing in this material world will matter, for none of it will exist when time ends. Most people you know think about their future, and they only focus on how we view the and value these temporal things. Many have elevated their judgment about how to live each day, but the only truth about the future is the truth from God.

> You and I have a view of the future, but we must realize the truth about the future is found in the God of truth. One truth cannot be changed. You and I will without any doubt experience it. "And these will go away into everlasting punishment, but the righteous into life eternal" (Matt. 25:46). Think soberly about the closing words of Peter's second epistle, "Since all these things will be dissolved, what manner of persons ought you to be in holy conduct and godliness?" (3:12).

Single Parents in God's Family

The toughest job in the world today is being a faithful Christian parent! While it can be difficult for a faithful dad and faithful mom to raise faithful kids together, the task is exponentially tough for a single parent doing it alone, or the Christian parent with an unbelieving spouse. If this is you, may I

offer you some encouragement? Let's focus for a moment on what you do have instead of on what you don't have.

Remember that you are not alone in this! Know without any doubt that God sees you, hears you and is walking with you every day. Read about how He cared for Hagar (Gen. 16:1-13; 21:15-21), the widow of Zarephath (1 Kgs. 17:8-24) and Eunice (Acts 16:1-3; 2 Tim. 1:5). Your God is actively present in your home with you (Heb. 13:5-6). Count on it!

Remember the Bible example of one faithful parent who raised a strong, faithful child. Timothy's dad was an unbeliever (Acts 16:3), but his mother raised a powerful servant of God. How did she do it? First, Scripture lived in their home from Timothy's infancy (2 Tim. 3:14-15), and faith was lived out in front of him (2 Tim. 1:5). Second, we see that she leaned on a godly grandparent (2 Tim. 1:5). You can do this!

Remember that God will fill in the gaps where you feel that you struggle. He said that He will give you wisdom when you ask (Jas. 1:5). He said that He will give you strength, even in the midst of your weakest moments (2 Cor. 12:9-10; Eph. 6:10). He said that He will provide your needs (Matt. 6:25 -34). Trust Him! There is no single Christian parent who He has ever left alone! Let Him be the Father in your home!

Remember to fill your home with Scripture and pray-

Regular Bible study time and even Scriptures posted around the house (Deut. 6:4-9) remind your child of God's love

> and wisdom. Opening your heart to God in prayer and teaching your child to do the same (Phil. 4:6-7) will help them to put their trust in Him and lean on Him. If your child sees this in you, there is nothing more valuable that you could give them. Little moments can have big impacts!

you every day! Finally, remember that your church family surrounds you and your children. God designed the

> church to bear burdens together, encourage one another and help your family flourish in Christ (Gal. 6:2, 10; Eph. 4:16; 6:1-4). You are NOT alone! You are surrounded by Christians who can be spiritual grandpas, grandmas, uncles and aunts. You are loved! And you may not realize it, but your steadfastness is an encouragement to the rest of us!

> You are not forgotten by God (Heb. 6:10)! Do not grow weary (Gal. 6:9) or think you are alone (Matt. 28:20)! God will do great things for you and with you! You've got this!

In the middle ages, the joust became a very popular event. It was a battle between warriors of the noble class showing off their skills to win prizes. It was very dangerous and violent.

The event mainly served as entertainment for the people, but there were a

couple secondary benefits. It kept the skills of these professional soldiers sharp, and it served as an outlet for their aggression. Knights were raised for the purpose of battle. They went through years of rigorous train- message was the ing from a young age so that they could effectively fight wars. If that kind of skill isn't put into practice, there is a high chance they might lose it or find themselves getting into trouble.

Something very similar can happen when a Christian doesn't actively practice their faith. Christians have been created for a very important purpose: to spread the gospel of Jesus Christ (Matt. 28:18-20). The New Testament tells us that we are to be soldiers for Christ in this effort (1 Tim. 1:18; 2 Tim. 2:3). We have been issued weapons to fight this battle (2 Cor. 10:4-6; Eph. 6:17), we have been fitted with armor to protect us (Eph. 6:11-18), and we have been taught how to use them (2 Tim. 1:13; 3:16-17). If we do not put these into practice, we will lose them, and we will probably find ourselves getting into trouble.

It is hard for a lazy Christian to remain a Christian. A soldier of Christ requires training. 2 Timothy 2:15 tells us, "Be diligent to present yourself approved to God, a worker who does not need to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth." If we are lazy in our studies, we will grow weak in the knowledge of the Bible.

> A soldier of Christ also requires missions. The gospel message was the primary drive for Paul and the early church. Paul said in Acts 20:24, "But none of these things move me; nor do I count my life dear to myself, so that I may finish my race with joy, and the ministry which I received from the Lord Jesus, to testify to the gospel of the grace of God." If we are lazy in sharing the gospel, we will lose our purpose.

When Christians forget their purpose, it becomes much easier to fall into sin. 2 Thessalonians 3:11 tells us of Christians who stopped working and became disorderly and busybodies. Instead of being occupied with the Lord's work, they fixated on the affairs of others. What was Paul's solution? In verse 13, he tells us, "...do not grow weary in doing good."

As soldiers of Jesus Christ, we have the most important purpose in the entire world: to bring souls to Jesus. If we want to remain in Christ, we cannot neglect our purpose.

Congregational activity vs. individual responsibility

Since the congregation is singing in worship, does that alleviate my responsibility to sing to the congregation? No (Eph. 5:19). Since the congregation has a program to care for widows, does that remove my responsibility to visit and look after the widows of the congregation? No (Jas. 1:27). You see, congregational activity does not take the place of my individual responsibility. THOUGHT

Apply that to the Great Commission. Since the congregation is supporting missionaries around the world and posting teaching materials on its website and paying a fulltime preacher, does

that waive my responsibility to personally teach the gospel to lost souls? No, it does not (Matt. 16:15). Imagine God saying these exact words to you: "The things that you have heard... commit these to faithful men who will be able to teach others also" (2 Tim. 2:2).

A congregation may be very evangelistic (and hopefully all congregations are!), but the Great Commission is given to us individually, as well. How are each of us doing with that? – DS

Name brand matters

The price of name brand medications today can be extremely expensive, but generic brand often saves a huge amount. The same goes for name brand foods, as the generic brand (or store brand) can sometimes be half the price. This leads many to avoid the name brand as much as possible and just go with the cheapest option.

> Unfortunately, this mentality can sometimes creep into one's religion, as well. We sometimes want the "easy" or "less demanding" religion, or the one that is "closest to where I live," or the one with "the most convenient service times," or the one with "the largest number of

followers," etc. We set up our own criteria and satisfy ourselves with the one that satisfies us the most.

The Bible says that "there is no other NAME" than Christ by which "we must be saved" (Acts 4:12), that "all" we do must be done "in the NAME of the Lord Jesus" (Col. 3:17), and that "every knee should bow" at "the NAME of Jesus" (Phil. 2:9). There is only ONE NAME (brand) that matters and that saves! It's HIS way or NO way! Avoid cheap imitations! - DS
