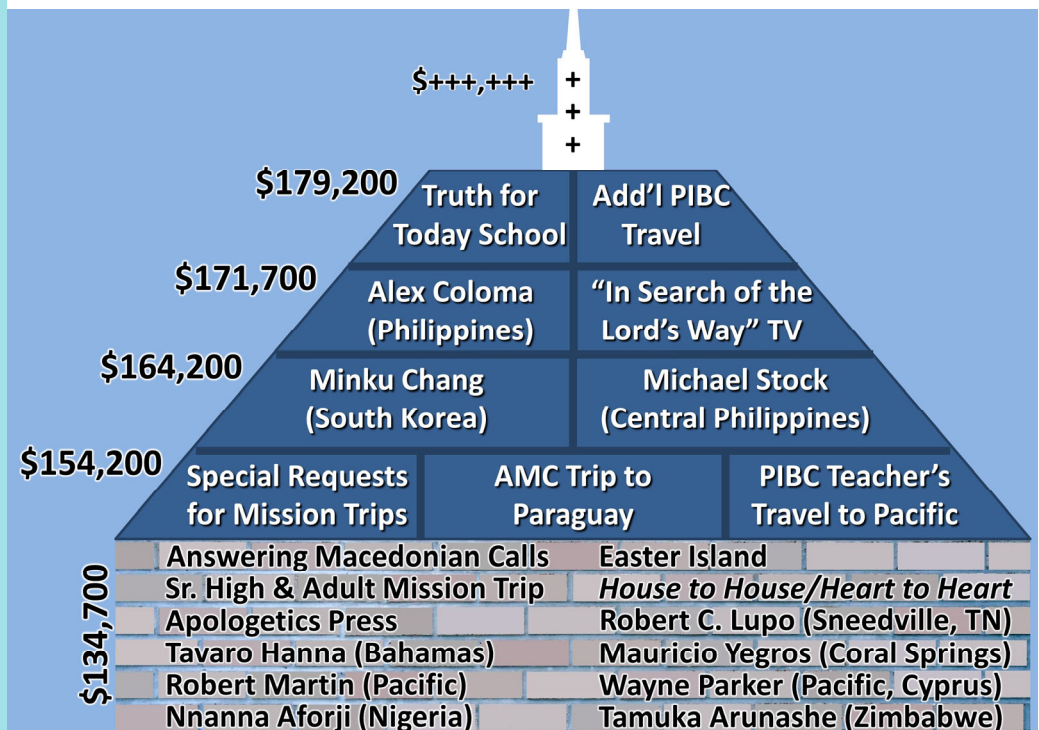

Every Secret Thing Matters

The closing words of the book of Ecclesiastes should be remembered by every person on this earth. The wisest man of the Old Testament, Solomon, said, "For God shall bring every work into judgment, with every secret thing, whether it be good, or whether it be evil" (12:14). That phrase, "every secret thing," when fully understood, will change your life.

It will help those who are all alone and feel like that person who sent invitations to come to his "pity party" and no one came. David said, "I looked on my right hand, and beheld, but there was no man that would know me; refuge failed me; no man cared for my soul" (Psa. 142:4).

The circumstances which trigger this despair may vary from person to person and from one situation to another. It might have happened at work or within the family or in another of life's situations. We were trying to do what Jesus said, and it seemed nothing good came out of it. When others spoke harshly and judgmental of us, we kept on speaking good to them. We wanted to do what Jesus told us to do, "Bless those who curse you, do good to those who hate you and pray for those who spitefully use you and persecute you" (Matt. 5:44). It did not seem to help; in fact, it got worse. We sit and wonder just how anyone could be so wicked.

It is always right to do right and always wrong to do wrong. It is always wrong...

This is when we need to remember what Solomon said about every secret thing. They did not win! The final chapter has not been written for that event, perhaps known by so few. It all changes when we remember that God will bring every secret thing that is said or done into the judgment.

It may be that we are discouraged because others do not appreciate what we are doing in helping others, especially our brothers and sisters. At such a time, we need to listen to Solomon's words about secret things. Jesus saw the widow's two mites. He sees even a cup of cold water we give to others. Secret things. However, not one single word or one single deed will be overlooked by Jesus. He remembers every good thing and every one of them will be brought into judgment.

So how should we react to events like those just described? Paul said, "Let us not grow weary while doing good, for in due season we shall reap if we do not lose heart" (Gal. 6:9). How others respond does not matter. Whether we are appreciated or not does not matter. God sees us. He sees those who wrong us. He sees every event in our lives that surrounds us. Every secret thing is remembered!

Do not ever forget this: "It is always right to do right, and it is always wrong to do wrong. It is never right to do wrong and never wrong to do right. This is right because the Bible." Secret things matter to Him!

A Verse Too Often Overlooked

I remember a young lady once hearing a lesson on First Thessalonians 5:22 and coming out and saying, "I had no idea that verse was in the Bible." Like many, she had danced around various worldly behaviors, trying to justify certain ones with statements like, "Well, the Bible doesn't really address that specifically." This verse hit her hard. While it's a short verse, it certainly packs a punch.

God warns His people throughout Scripture about "evil" and the present and eternal dangers associated with it. He tells us to "Abhor what is evil" (Rom. 12:9) and to "not be overcome by evil" (Rom. 12:21), for "the face of the Lord is against those who do evil" (1 Pet. 3:12). First Thessalonians 5:22 goes a little deeper than these passages.

The word "abstain" is a strong term. It is an imperative, denoting a direct command from God. It is in the middle voice in Greek, which emphasizes the direct involvement of the subject in action for which he has a vested stake. The present tense stresses the ongoing, continuous nature of this command. The Greek word for "abstain" means "to avoid contact with, keep away, refrain from, hold oneself from." There is no middle ground with this term—it involves absolute avoidance, being distant from something.

Anything that is "like" evil is "evil"!

The word "every" is an all-inclusive term. The same Greek word is used in Second Timothy 3:16, "All Scripture is given by inspiration of God." No Scripture is left out of that. The same word is in Hebrews 3:4, "Every house is built by someone." There are no exceptions to that. When God commands to abstain, avoid, keep away from "EVERY" of any thing, there are no exceptions or anything left out.

The word for "form" means any "variety or kind." The KJV translation of "appearance" is also good, as the Greek word can mean "outward appearance," as in "the appearance" of Jesus' face in Luke 9:29. Even more specific than abhorring, in general, what is evil (Rom. 12:9), this text underscores that every kind or appearance of evil must be avoided.

In a similar way, Galatians 5:19-21 spreads God's disapproval over any form of sin by listing a variety of sinful vices and then adding, "and the like," to cover anything else "like" these that may not be specifically mentioned. Anything that is "like" evil is "evil"!

As I seek to walk faithfully with the Lord, I must not quibble about whether a particular practice is specifically mentioned in the Bible or not. Every single kind of evil, without any exception, is condemned by God in Scripture and must be kept away from continually by God's children, if we are to "be holy in all [our] conduct" (1 Pet. 1:15-16).

What Makes the Bible So Great?

There are so many things we could say about what makes the Bible so great. We could talk about how it was transferred and preserved over so many centuries or how it never contradicts itself though it was written by about 40 men of incredibly diverse backgrounds. But, sometimes it's best to just let the Bible speak for itself. In Psalm 19, verses 7-9, David gives us six reasons why the Bible is so great.

First, David writes, "The law of the Lord is perfect, converting the soul..." (v. 7a). God's Word is the ultimate apologetic. It never makes mistakes. It is perfectly in harmony about the nature of God and His desire to rescue man from sin. The Bible continues to change the hearts of man to give up worldliness and embrace godliness.

Second, "The testimony of the Lord is sure, making wise the simple..." (v. 7b). The word "sure" means "faithful, reliable, or permanent." We can trust the Word of God because it never changes. So, no matter who picks up the Word of God, they can trust in the wisdom it gives.

Third, "The statutes of the Lord are right, rejoicing the heart..." (v. 8a). The Bible is never wrong about how we ought to live. If we are doing what the Bible says, then we know we are doing the right thing. What a relief it is that we do not have

to be in the dark on moral dilemmas.

Fourth, "The commandment of the Lord is pure, enlightening the eyes..." (v. 8b). Sometimes the way we perceive things clouds our judgment. As Jesus explained in Matthew 7:3-5, we must remove the planks from our eyes so that we can see clearly and judge others righteously. So, how do we clear up our preconceptions? We must see what the Lord commands in His Word and not go beyond it or take away from it.

Fifth, "The fear of the Lord is clean, enduring forever..." (v. 9a). The Bible teaches us our proper place before God. He is the eternal, loving Creator of the universe. If we submit to His will, the Bible shows us that we will live with Him forever.

Sixth, "The judgments of the Lord are true and righteous altogether" (v. 9b). The Bible reveals the perfect character of our heavenly Father. I can rest assured that all things that God has decreed are what is best for me. I have no need to question His perfect judgment.

The Bible is the greatest book ever written because it is the Word of the living God. How precious are the words of God to you? Verse 10 of Psalm 19 says, "More to be desired are they than gold, Yea, than much fine gold; Sweeter also than honey and the honeycomb." Do you desire to study the Bible like you should? Do you talk to others about the Bible like you should? How great is the Bible to you?

"Nobody" does, but do I?

When the Bible says that something is "not wise," it ought to cause us to really pay attention. In 2 Corinthians 10:12, Paul shows us that it is "not wise" to spend any effort in "measuring" ourselves or "comparing" ourselves with others. Doing so will usually make us either feel guilty or feel better. But what others do or don't do is not our standard! Consider one application.

Sometimes we might say, "Nobody speaks to me at church." But, rather than use that as my standard, do I myself openly, lovingly, intentionally speak to others at church? We might say, "Nobody invites me out to lunch." But, do I invite anyone else out to lunch? We may say, "Nobody invites me over to their house." But, do I invite anyone to my house?

God says, "A man who has friends must himself be friendly" (Prov. 18:24). Rather than measure out what we might consider the "unfriendliness" of others, let us set an example of our own in reaching out, engaging, fellowshiping, encouraging and bonding with our brethren. Such will bless all of us reciprocally! – DS



Love triumphant still in death

The words of the song are over 180 years old. One would think that something written that long ago could not retain its meaning in modern times. Such a conclusion would be mistaken. John R. Wreford (in 1837) wrote the hymn, "When My Love to Christ Grows Weak." The words of that hymn are so moving. Consider this fourth verse, "There behold His agony, Suffered on the bitter tree; See His anguish, see His faith—Love triumphant still in death."

Think about those last words: "Love triumphant still in death." The concepts of "death" and "victory" do not often go together. Usually "death" is associated with "loss" or "defeat"—but not when it comes to our Lord! "Through death," Jesus was able to "destroy him who had the power of death, that is, the devil" (Heb. 2:14-15). His love was "triumphant still in death."

What about us? Will our "love" lead us to triumph in our service to the Lord? Only if we do not give up! No matter what happens to us, if we focus on magnifying Christ in all things, then even for us, death can be "gain"—i.e., ultimate victory (Phil. 1:20-21)! – DS

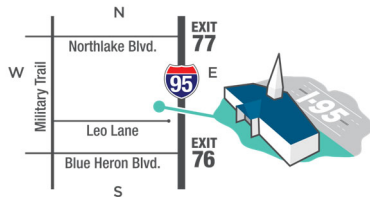
