

The Heart of Those Who Seek the Lost

When Paul arrived in Thessalonica, his body showed the shameful treatment he had received at Philippi. He and Silas had just been dragged into the marketplace, brought before the magistrates who ripped their garments off of them and publicly beaten them with rods, and they received many stripes.

They were thrown into jail where they could hardly move because their feet were securely fastened in stocks. At midnight they were singing praises to God!

The next day, they left Philippi and arrived in Thessalonica—their bodies showing the beating they had just received. These two men immediately began teaching the lost. They were there for only three weeks before severe persecution arose, and the new Christians there helped them escape by night. Read all the details in Acts chapters sixteen and seventeen.

Paul did not forget them, and shortly afterwards wrote his first letter to them. While he mentions what had happened in Philippi, he did not have to give details of what those babes in Christ had actually seen. He devotes an entire chapter of the epistle to describe his attitude in preaching. Every soul winner and preacher should read 1 Thessalonians 2 to have his own life changed by seeing the heart each of us should have. Read this chapter often and meditate on it.

Note the great faith and spirituality we all should have as we teach others. Prayerfully consider the following:

- He boldly spoke the gospel (v. 2).
- He boldly spoke the gospel surrounded by conflict (v. 2).
- He was not deceitful with hidden motives (v. 3).
- He understood God had entrusted him with the gospel.
- He spoke only the message entrusted to him (v. 4).
 - He spoke not to please men, but his Judge (v. 4).
 - He did not use flattering words (v. 5).
 - He was not doing this to gain money (v. 5).
 - He sought no glory from any man (v. 6).
 - He was gentle like a mother in dealing with them.
 - He cherished them like they were his children (v. 7).
- He affectionally longed to save them (v. 8).
- He was not lazy, but labored day and night (v. 9).
- He was devout, just and blameless (v. 10).
- He exhorted and comforted like a father (v. 11).
- His goal was to lead them to walk in a new way in the new kingdom (v. 12).
- He prayed for them without ceasing (v. 13).

What Does the Bible Say About Miracles?

The Bible is filled with powerful, awe-inspiring miracles. These great works were supernatural events (Acts 2:22), that could not be explained by natural law. While miracles permeate Scripture, they were not continuous throughout history, nor were they granted to all of God's people. This alone indicates a Divine purpose behind their appearance and their timing. When the Bible is allowed to define miracles, it is clear that God designed them for a specific work that has been completed.

The Bible teaches that miracles had a defined purpose. Their first purpose was **revelation**—to reveal all truth to the apostles and inspired writers (John 14:26; 16:13; 1 Cor. 2:10-13). Their second purpose was **confirmation**—to prove that the message they preached was truly from God (John 3:2; Mark 16:20; Heb. 2:3-4). Their third purpose was **producing faith**, both in those who witnessed them and in all who later read of them (John 20:30-31; Rom. 10:17). Once God's message was fully revealed, fully confirmed and fully recorded, the purpose of miracles was fulfilled (and does not need to be re-confirmed).

The Bible teaches that miraculous power had a defined means of reception. In the New Testament, there were only two ways a person received the ability to perform mira-

cles: (1) the baptism of the Holy Spirit and (2) the laying on of the apostles' hands. Holy Spirit baptism only occurred twice—upon the apostles in Acts 2 and upon Cornelius in Acts 10—both for unique, foundational purposes. The other means was through the physical hands of living apostles (Acts 8:14-19; 19:6; 2 Tim. 1:6). Since the apostles are no longer living and Holy Spirit baptism is not occurring today (Eph. 4:5), there is no avenue through which miraculous power can be received.

Thus, the miraculous age cannot continue.

The Bible defines the duration of miracles.

Miraculous gifts were temporary, lasting only "till we all come to the unity of the faith" (Eph. 4:13). God's revelation was given part-by-part through miraculous gifts but would cease "when that which is perfect"—the complete revelation—came (1 Cor. 13:8-10).

Once the New Testament was finished, the church reached maturity, the partial gave way to the complete, and miracles fulfilled their God-given purpose.

In conclusion, Biblical miracles accomplished exactly what God intended—they revealed truth, confirmed it and produced saving faith. Today, we possess the fully revealed, fully confirmed Word of God, which "thoroughly equips" us in every good work (2 Tim. 3:16-17). While the age of miracles has ended, the power of God's written Word remains—living, active and sufficient for all who seek Him.

Maybe Jesus' offer doesn't feel real enough. Some might think, "All we know is the world around us and despite the challenges, I feel I'm pretty much in control. So why change my life for a heaven I can't see?" But, Jesus rose from the dead. That means everything He said about heaven is true. Jesus said, "In My Father's house are many mansions; if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and receive you to Myself; that where I am, there you may be also" (John 14:2-3). Jesus saw heaven and is preparing it for all who accept His offer. And since Jesus is alive, I know it is true (cf. 1 Cor. 15:20-21).

Maybe they believe everything Jesus said about heaven, but they just aren't ready to make the changes necessary to accept it. Then, perhaps they don't know how great the offer is. In Revelation 21:4, the Bible tells us, "God will wipe away every tear from their eyes; there shall be no more death, nor sorrow, nor crying. Where's the wisdom in having a drink?

When one reads the book of Proverbs, he will find the word "wise" 72 times and the word "wisdom" 50 times. Yes, the book of Proverbs was written "to know wisdom and instruction" (1:2), for "a wise man will hear and increase learning" (1:5) and "receive commands" (10:8). The wise, inspired penman pleaded, "Pay attention to my wisdom" (5:1), "Hear instruction and be wise" (8:33). When one truly has "the fear of the Lord" in his soul, it will lead to godly "wisdom" (9:10) that "fears and departs from evil" (14:16) and refuses any impulse to "be wise in [his] own eyes" (3:7).

With so much emphasis on being "wise" in the book, there is one verse that emphasizes that something is "NOT wise." Please, read it carefully. This isn't a verse in which to search for loopholes. It's the wisdom from heaven! "Wine is a mocker, Strong drink is a brawler, And whoever is led astray by it is not wise" (20:1). Rather than sanction any number of drinks, God affirms that consumption of alcoholic beverages, in general, is "not wise"! Can you drink alcohol and still be considered "wise" by God? – DS



He doesn't ask for my own blood, but...

Under the Levitical system, priests would offer the blood of animals (certainly not the priest's own personal blood) to make atonement for the sins of the people (Ex. 29:36-37), but that blood could not "take away sins" (Heb. 10:4). But, when Christ came into the world, He did not come to offer someone else's blood.

Note the emphasis in these four verses. "The church of God" was "purchased with His OWN BLOOD" (Acts 20:28). It was "Not with the blood of goats and calves, but with His OWN BLOOD" that He "obtained eternal redemption" (Heb. 9:12). In order to "sanctify the people," Jesus "suffered" and gave "His OWN BLOOD" (Heb. 13:12). What a marvel it is to think how Christ "loved us and washed us from our sins in His OWN BLOOD" (Rev. 1:5).

These are the only four verses in the New Testament with the words "His own blood." They emphasize that it is Christ's own blood (and no other blood) that was given to wash us, purchase us, redeem us and sanctify us! He paid the ultimate price! What kind of sacrifice have I made for Him? – DS


