## The Good, the Bad, the Ugly in the Church—Then What?

The expression “The good, the bad, the ugly” is widely used in our culture. It originated from a movie by this title released in 1966. There were three characters starring in it with each having one of the distinct personality traits found in the title. Over the next few weeks, we will use this approach to look at churches in the first century.

**The church at Ephesus: the good.** It was established by Paul on his third missionary journey and became the center of the evangelizing of the Roman province of Asia.

Paul preached in this city longer than in any other place he lived and during that time all of Asia heard the gospel (Acts 19:10). Later Timothy came to the city to continue the work as it grew. In the book of Acts, we read Paul’s conversation with the elders of this great church. There is so much good in those early years of this congregation.

In the book of Revelation, more good can be found, when John writes to them from the island of Patmos. Paul had told those elders that after he left false teachers, some from within the congregation and others from without, would enter the church to destroy it. When John writes to them, it was obvious how seriously that eldership had taken Paul’s words.

**Tongues without love is just noise. So is standing for the truth without love.**

There were some who were claiming they were apostles, and the elders and the church realized this and did not allow these false teachers to harm the church. John said that their labors to stand for the truth in this way continued and they had not become weary in doing this (Rev. 2:3). Then there were other false teachers who brought in the doctrine of the Nicolaitans, and both the church and the Lord hated this doctrine (2:6).

**Ephesus: the bad.** Things were not all good in this church because a serious problem had developed. It is a problem that often develops in both preachers and churches. Their focus had been so centered on dealing with error that the love they once had for the Lord was not what it once was. John said they had left their first love, but this does not mean they had turned against Jesus who they loved. Leaving your first love simply means that they had forgotten how much they loved Jesus at first. That had greatly diminished.

**Ephesus: the ugly.** How serious is that when it happens to a church? The answer to this is the “ugly” of this church. Tongues minus love, prophecies minus love and knowledge minus love are often just noise like a clanging cymbal (1 Cor. 13). So is standing for the truth minus taking seriously what Jesus said lay in this church’s future: “I will come and remove your candlestick” (3:5). Keeping this love will lead to eating from the tree of life. Another church next week.

## “Has God Indeed Said?”

The Bible begins with God speaking and with God speaking in very clear terms. The first chapter of the Bible presents God speaking eleven times. “God said...God said...God said...God said...God said...God said...God blessed them, saying...God said...God said...God said to them...God said” (Gen. 1:3, 6, 9, 11, 14, 20, 22, 24, 26, 28, 29). Of the 31 verses in that first chapter, God speaks in 13 of them.

In chapter two, we read “God said” in verse 18, and even greater still, verses 16-17 read, “And the Lord God commanded the man, saying, ‘Of every tree of the garden you may freely eat; but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall surely die.’”

Did the woman know about what “God said”? Most certainly. The woman said, “We may eat the fruit of the trees of the garden; but of the fruit of the tree which is in the midst of the garden, **God has said**, ‘You shall not eat it, nor shall you touch it, lest you die’” (Gen. 3:2-3). Did you notice what the woman said? She knew exactly what “God said.”

That makes the devil’s efforts even more audacious on this occasion! The first chapters are filled with “God said” and the woman knew clearly what “God said,” yet the devil still cunningly queried, “Has God indeed said?” (3:1). The devil

knows the answer to that question! And the devil is not worried whether you know the answer to that question! All he wants to do is to plant a little seed of doubt or a little seed of displeasure at what God has said! And once “the devil” has “put it into [your] heart” (John 13:2), he’s got you where he wants you. And he uses that same tactic today.

Perhaps the devil has caused you to question or doubt or find displeasure in certain things that “God has said.” It’s as if the devil is putting into your heart the same kind of question that he used on Eve: “Has God indeed said...do not forsake the assembling of the saints?” “Has God indeed said...do not lie to another?” “Has God indeed said...do not look upon a woman to lust after her?” “Has God indeed said...give as you have been prospered?” “Has God indeed said...abstain from fleshly lusts that war against the soul?” “Has God indeed said...obey the elders who rule over you and be submissive to them?” “Has God indeed said...do good unto all men?” “Has God indeed said...be patient with all?” “Has God indeed said...esteem others better than myself?” “Has God indeed said...teach others the gospel?” “Has God indeed said...seek first the Lord’s church and His righteousness?”

The devil still works the same way he did in the beginning. He runs at you right in the face of what “God said” and tries to get you to ignore it. Don’t let him win!

## Why Fishermen?

I recently decided to take up fishing. I went many times with my dad and brothers while growing up. However, I never got interested in fishing with any kind of consistency or attempting to gain any real skill or knowledge. In the past, my dad did everything. So, I'm having to learn it all for myself.

Now, I've realized that fishing is way harder than I thought! When I got all my new gear, I thought I'd be pulling in bass left and right. But, that couldn't be further from the truth. I can hardly get any bites. And when I finally do, landing the fish is a whole other story. Maybe I'm just bad, but it made think about the kind of fishing that all Christians are meant to do.

In Matthew 4:18-22, Jesus meets Simon Peter and Andrew while they were fishing, and later, James and John, the sons of Zebedee while they were mending their fishing nets. In verse 19, Jesus tells Peter and Andrew, "Follow Me, and I will make you fishers of men," which they immediately did. And James and John would do the same.

All four apostles recognized that Jesus was asking them to go after a much more valuable catch than the fish they'd been seeking. Jesus wanted them to bring Him souls by preaching the gospel of the kingdom (cf. v. 23). But, what does fishing have to do with preaching? As a novice angler, there

are a few things that I've observed.

First, fishing takes skill. You have to learn many techniques in order to increase your chances of landing a fish. You have to be able to tie different knots and you have to be able to move the bait in the water according to its design. Winning souls also requires skills. You must choose your words wisely. Jesus says, "Behold, I send you out as sheep in the midst of wolves. Therefore be wise as serpents and harmless as doves."

Next, fishing also requires knowledge. You need to study in order to know what kind of fish you're after, what kind of bait attracts them, and what seasons they're active. Similarly, we must study the Bible to be able to reach people with God's message. "Be diligent to present yourself approved to God, a worker who does not need to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth" (2 Tim. 2:15).

Finally, fishing requires patience. You can't expect to catch a fish on every cast. If you give up too quickly, you will never land a big one! Likewise, we must allow God's work to develop in His time. Paul says in Galatians 6:9, "And let us not grow weary while doing good, for in due season we shall reap if we do not lose heart."

If we want to be fishers of men like the apostles, we must work to gain the skills, knowledge and patience necessary.

### They weren't saved before baptism—not an exception

The Bible says that "the Holy Spirit fell upon all those who heard the word" in Cornelius' house (Acts 10:44). Many have decided that this means that the Gentiles were saved at this point. However, the Bible never says that they were saved when the Holy Spirit fell upon them, and in fact, it says just the opposite.

Cornelius was told by an angel of the Lord that Peter would come and "tell you words by which you and all your household will be saved" (11:14). The "words" of the gospel are essential for salvation (Rom. 1:16; 10:9-17; Jas. 1:21). Peter reported, "And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them..." (11:15). Before they heard the "words" by which they could "be saved," the Spirit fell upon them. Therefore, the Bible says that they were not saved yet at that point.

Then, when were Cornelius and his household saved? Peter "commanded them to be baptized in the name of the Lord" (10:48). Why? For the same reason he commanded the Jews—"for the remission of sins" (2:38). The Bible is consistent in God's plan of salvation. – DS



### Are you persuaded?

The word "persuaded" is used multiple times in the New Testament. Its Greek origin (*peitho*) means "to cause to come to a particular point of view or course of action," such as when Agrippa said to Paul, "You almost persuade me to become a Christian" (Acts 26:28). Have you fully yielded yourself, having been fully persuaded to the truth of Christ and His word?

The Greek word can also be used to mean "to attain certainty in reference to something," as when Paul said that he was "persuaded that [Christ] is able" (2 Tim. 1:12) and "persuaded" that nothing "shall be able to separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Rom. 8:38-39). Do you have that absolute certainty?

The Christian life is based upon factual, reliable, verifiable evidence, in which you can have complete confidence. Some choose to be "persuaded," while others are "not persuaded" (Acts 17:4-5). Have you been "altogether" persuaded by the evidence (Acts 26:29)? If so, have you "committed" your life "altogether" to your Lord and His will for your life (2 Tim. 1:12b)? – DS

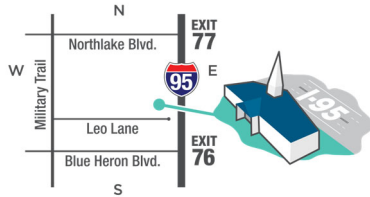
